

EMERGENCY ALERT CHECKLIST FOR FAMILY AND FRIENDS

In the event you receive an emergency alert from spidertracks about me please do the following:

1. Try to contact me on
2. Try to contact the following people to see if they know where I am:

3. If you receive an email alert, click on the link provided in the email to see my track.
If you receive a text alert, please access your emails and click on the link provided.
If you can not access the track from the link provided in the alert email log on to spidertracks.com.

4. See whether my aircraft or vehicle is still moving. If I'm still moving but you can't raise me on cell phone or radio, it is possible the alert has been accidentally activated.
5. If I appear to have stopped moving, you can't raise me, or if any time you are concerned about my safety, please contact the rescue coordination centre.
The local rescue coordination centre number is:.....
Note: Spidertracks recommends contacts call the local rescue coordination centre first because they may also have received an alert from your ELT and they have experience searching for missing aircraft and boats.
If you can not contact the RCC, please contact local Police and advise that you think the aircraft or vessel is in trouble and that you last heard from them at ...(provide the information received in your text or email alert). Note, they may not be aware of how spidertracks alerting works.
6. Provide the rescue coordination centre with information about my last GPS position, altitude, speed and direction and/or access to my track at spidertracks.com.
